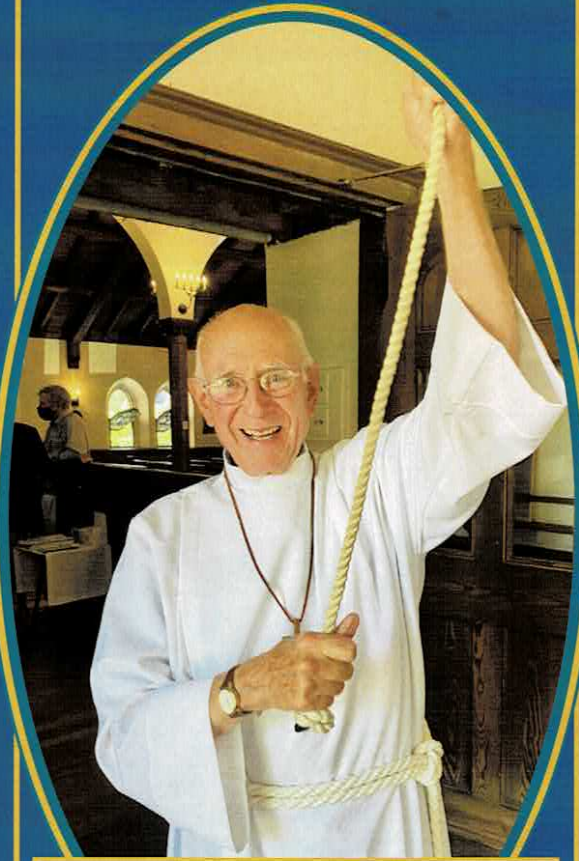

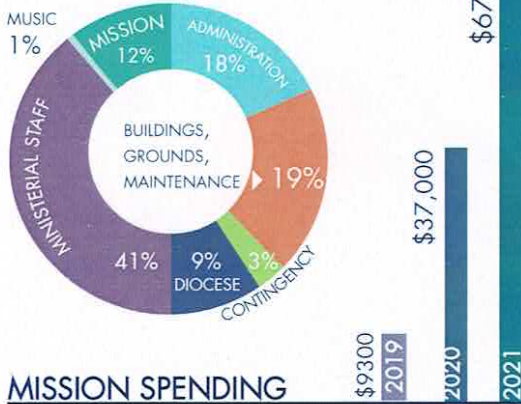

A MESSAGE FROM THE STEWARDSHIP CO-CHAIRS

Blessed with your contributions, St. Paul's was able to face the challenges of the pandemic and to provide meaningful community assistance during 2021. In 2022, we want to grow our work, and we are once again asking for your generosity to do this.
